Zapplication Guide for Artists

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Logging In

Visit <u>Zapplication</u> to create a new account or log into your existing account. If your existing account has been inactive for 24 months they are automatically disabled and you will need to email <u>contactzapp@westaf.org</u> for assistance.

Image Requirements

Before beginning the application process it is a good idea to review the Zapplication image requirements:

Minimum Image Requirements

- Dimensions: 1400 pixels on the longest side
- File Format: jpeg, jpg, tiff, png
- File Size: Under 5 MB

Recommended Image Requirements

Dimensions: 1920 pixels on the longest side.

File Format: jpeg, jpg, tiff, png

File Size: Under 5 MB


Resolution: 72 ppi – 300 ppi

Color space: sRGB

Uploading Images to Your Portfolio


To upload an artwork image to ZAPP, follow these steps:

1. Within your Portfolio, click the "Artwork Images" tab and click "Upload Artwork Image".



2. Select "Browse" to upload an image from your computer. Fill in the required fields that are in bold. You can disregard the other fields that are X-ed out below.

**Required fields are in bold



- 3. Please note only files that meet Zapplication's image requirements will upload.
- 4. Click "Submit" to upload your image.

NOTE: No need to upload a booth shot to your portfolio - those will not be viewed for our application

Editing Images

To edit, copy, or delete images and image information uploaded on ZAPP, click on the thumbnail of the image you want to edit.


On the View Media page, you have the option to copy, edit, or delete the image. You can also see all image information and you can view an enlarged version of the image by clicking on the image. Once in the enlarged image view, you can return to the View Media page by clicking the "X" in the upper right hand corner.



If you click the "Copy" button, ZAPP will copy the image and its information. The title will be the title you originally entered with the word (Copy) after it.

If you click the "Delete" button, ZAPP will delete the image and its information. The image and its information will not be deleted from any applications submitted.

If you click the "Edit" button, you will be able to update any image information or replace the image with another image. If you accidentally marked artwork as a booth shot or vice versa, you can update that information by editing your image.



After you have made changes to your image and its information, click "Submit" to save your changes. Any edits made will not be reflected on applications submitted before the changes were made.

Uploading Artist Statement of Technique

Within your Portfolio, you can also save up to six Statements of Technique. Every application on ZAPP will ask for a Statement of Technique, though the length of the statement allowed may differ. Your statement of technique should describe the materials and techniques used to create your artwork. Jurors will have access to your Statement of Technique.


Note: You are not required to upload your Statement of Technique - you can also type or paste it into your application.


To create and save a Statement of Technique, click on Saved Statements from the Artist Portfolio and click the "Create Statement" button.



Clicking the "Create Statement" button will open the Statement of Technique editor. You will be prompted to title your statement and choose the character limit. The ACC Statement of Technique character limit is 500 characters.

Once you have saved a statement of technique, you can edit, copy, or delete the statement by clicking on the dropdown arrow on the Manage Statements of Technique page and then selecting the button for the desired action:






The Application


When you are ready to apply, click the <u>show link</u> provided by ACC, or search for the ACC show on Zapp's main page. Click the "Apply to this Show" button at the top of the page under the event's logo.



Before starting the application, you must agree to the event's terms and conditions. You can print or save the legal agreement from this page. Once you agree to the terms, you will see the application.



The Application: Answering Application Questions



Select a medium category and insert or write a Statement of Technique. If you have saved a Statement of Technique to your Zapplication Profile, you can click the "Insert" button and select the statement you would like to add. It will appear inside the text box to the left. You can also type or paste your statement directly into the text box.

If you are unable to insert your statement, it may be that the statement exceeds the application's character limit. To learn more about saving Statements of Technique to your profile, refer to this section.

You can then complete all the following sections of the application. All of these questions and sections are required.



The Application: Attaching Images

If you have already <u>uploaded images to your Portfolio</u>, they will automatically appear in the box that says "Artwork Images". It is possible that you will see old images there from previous applications, or no images if you have not previously uploaded any. In that case you will want to click on "Upload New Images" and follow the steps outlined <u>here</u>. We require a total of 5 images for your application. We do not require or consider booth photos.


Once you have the current images uploaded, in the "Artwork Images" box, select the images you want to attach to the application. <u>Click here</u> to learn more about uploading and editing images and image descriptions.

As you select the images, you will see them appear in the "Selected Samples to Submit" box.



My Portfolio

Only images uploaded to your portfolio can be added to an application. To add a new image, click "Upload New Images." Click on an image to add it to your application. Your images will appear to jurors in the order you selected them. To update, click Change Image Order and rearrange your images.




Images will initially be in the order you selected them. Jurors will view your images in the order submitted. Click "Change Image Order" to drag and drop your images into the preferred order.



Finishing Your Application


Once you are satisfied with your selection, click the "Save and Preview" button at the bottom of the page to preview your application.



In 'Preview as Juror', you will be able to see your images as they will display to jurors. You can zoom in and out on images by scrolling or by using the bar at the top of the preview window.

After reviewing your application, if you need to make edits, click the "Edit Application" button. You will be unable to edit your application without permission from the administrator once you have completed checkout. To submit your application, click the green "Checkout" button and proceed to the ZAPP Shop to pay your application fee. Once you have paid your fee, your application will be listed as Received on the My ZAPPlications page.

At checkout follow the steps to pay your application fee/s. If you have been given a promo code, enter it under the tab **#3 Add Coupons** in the box under "Coupon".

Applying Multiple Times

If you would like to apply for multiple media, you will be required to submit an application for each separate media category. We will limit the number of applications to three per artist. If you submit an application with work that includes more than one media category we will ask that you resubmit. All jewelry images must all be submitted under Jewelry. For example, if you create glass vessels and glass jewelry, you must submit them with separate applications and images, as they will be scored by separate juries.

To submit another application click "Apply to More Shows" on the Application Preview page, select the show again from your My ZAPPlications page and click the "Apply to Show" button. Fill out the application and checkout another application.

FAQ's

- **Q**: When creating my portfolio do I need to upload a booth shot or other files?
 - No, those items will not be considered during jurying
- Q: Do I have to complete my application all at once, or will my information save?
 - You do not need to complete your application all at once, you can save your progress and come back to it. Your application will be saved under the "Zapplications" tab when you sign into Zapplication. Click the Save and Continue button often to save your progress and avoid losing your work.
- **Q**: Can I make changes to my application after I have submitted it?
 - If you need to make changes to your application after it is submitted, please email shows@craftcouncil.org
